3.12 <u>Award of Contract - Gym Folding Doors Replacement – Heritage Middle School</u>

Whereas, on May 12, 2011, the Livingston Township Board of Education ("Board") held a public bid opening for the Heritage Middle School Folding Door project ("Project"); and

Whereas, the Project consisted of two separate facets of Work, the Folding Door Replacement and the Folding Curtain Assemblies, for which the Bidders were asked to give separate prices and which the Board reserved the right to award separately;

Whereas, the Board received four (4) bids at the public bid opening; and

Whereas, the lowest bid for the Folding Door Replacement Work submitted by T.G. Elliott Associates, Inc. ("T.G. Elliott") contained conditions imposed by T.G. Elliott which were not consistent with the Project specifications, and also failed to include documentation indicating that T.G. Elliott is classified by the Department of Treasury as required by N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-26; and

Whereas, the Board has determined that the above issues with T.G. Elliott's bid make the bid non-responsive and constitute material, non-waivable defects; and

Whereas, the next lowest bid for the Folding Door Replacement Work was submitted by Tri-State Folding Partitions, Inc. ("Tri-State"), Chestnut Ridge, New York, with a base bid of Seventy Six Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$76,500.00); and

Whereas, the Board, upon consultation with its Design Professional, has determined Tri-State to be the lowest responsive and responsible bidder; and

Whereas, the Board's counsel has determined Tri-State's bid to be awardable.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, that for the reasons set forth above, the Board hereby rejects the bid of T.G. Elliott on the basis that the bid is non-responsive and contains material, non-waivable defects; and

Be It Further Resolved, that in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-1, et seq., the Board hereby awards a contract for the Folding Door Replacement Work for the Project to **Tri-State Folding Partitions**, **Inc.** in the amount of **Seventy Six Thousand Five Hundred Dollars** (\$76,500.00); and

Be It Further Resolved, that the Business Administrator is authorized to return the bid bonds to all but the three (3) lowest bidders; and

Be It Further Resolved, that the Board's Counsel is hereby authorized to prepare the contract for the Project, transmit same to Tri-State, and to obtain all documents required thereby; and

Whereas, the Board received four (4) bids at the public bid opening; and

Whereas, the lowest bid for the Folding Curtain Assemblies Work was submitted by Tomkin Company, a division of MPS, Inc. ("Tomkin"), Scotch Plains, New Jersey, with a base bid of Thirteen Thousand Three Hundred One Dollars (\$13,301.00); and

Whereas, the Board, upon consultation with its Design Professional, has determined Tomkin to be the lowest responsive and responsible bidder; and

Whereas, the Board's counsel has determined Tomkin's bid to be awardable.

Now, Therefore Be It Resolved, that in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-1, et seq., the Board hereby awards a contract for the Folding Curtain Assemblies Work for the Project to **Tomkin Company, a division of MPS, Inc.** in the amount of **Thirteen Thousand Three Hundred One Dollars (\$13,301.00)**; and

Be It Further Resolved, that the Business Administrator is authorized to return the bid bonds to all but the three (3) lowest bidders; and

Be It Further Resolved, that the Board's Counsel is hereby authorized to prepare the contract for the Project, transmit same to Tomkin, and to obtain all documents required thereby; and

Whereas, the Specifications for the Project permitted the Board to award separate contracts for the various portions of the Work; and

Whereas, the Board received five (5) bids at the public bid opening; and

Whereas, the lowest bid for all of the Vinyl Tile Removal Work and the Heritage Middle School Auditorium Seating Removal work was submitted by Lilich Corporation ("Lilich"), Woodland Park, New Jersey, with a bid of One Hundred Twenty Nine Thousand Dollars (\$129,000.00) for all of the

Vinyl Tile Removal work and a bid of Four Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$4,600.00) for the Heritage Middle School Auditorium Seating Removal Work; and

Whereas, the Board, in conjunction with its Design Professional, has determined Lilich to be the lowest responsive and responsible bidder for the above noted portions of the Work; and

Whereas, the Board's Special Counsel for Construction has determined Lilich's bid to be awardable.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, that in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-1, et. seq., the Board hereby awards a contract for the Vinyl Tile Removal Work and the Heritage Middle School Auditorium Seating Removal Work for the Project to Lilich Corporation in the amount of One Hundred Thirty Three Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$133,600.00), consisting of a bid of One Hundred Twenty Nine Thousand Dollars (\$129,000.00) for all of the Vinyl Tile Removal Work and a bid of Four Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$4,600.00) for the Heritage Middle School Auditorium Seating Removal Work; and

Be It Further Resolved, that the Business Administrator is authorized to return the bid bonds to all but the three (3) lowest bidders; and

Be It Further Resolved, the Board hereby directs its Special Counsel for Construction to prepare the contracts for the Project, transmit same to Lilich for execution, and to obtain all the documents required thereby; and

Be It Further Resolved, that upon receipt of the executed contract from Lilich, as well as the insurance certificate, bonds and other documents required by the contract, the Business Administrator is authorized to return the bid bonds to all remaining bidders.

3.15 <u>Award of Contract – Asbestos Removal/Treatment – Various Schools</u>

Whereas, on June 1, 2011, the Livingston Board of Education ("Board") held a public bid opening for the Asbestos Vinyl Tile, Insulation, Transom, Caulking Removal project ("Project"); and

Whereas, the Specifications for the Project permitted the Board to award separate contracts for the various portions of the Work; and

Whereas, the Board received five (5) bids at the public bid opening; and

Whereas, the lowest bid for all of the Transite Panel and Caulking Work and the Hillside Ceiling Tile/Glue/Sheetrock Work was submitted by Metro Contractors, LLC ("Metro), Wayne, New Jersey, with a bid of One Hundred Forty Two Thousand Three Hundred Dollars (\$142,300.00) for all of the Transite Panel and Caulking Work, and a bid of Six Thousand Nine Hundred Dollars (\$6,900.00) for the Hillside Ceiling Tile/Glue/Sheetrock Work; and

Whereas, the Board, in conjunction with its Design Professional, has determined Metro to be the lowest responsive and responsible bidder for the above noted portions of the Work; and

Whereas, the Board's Special Counsel for Construction has determined Metro's bid to be awardable.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, that in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-1, <u>et</u>. <u>seq</u>., the Board hereby awards a contract for the Transite Panel and Caulking Work and the Hillside Ceiling Tile/Glue/Sheetrock Work for the Project to **Metro Contractors, LLC** in the amount of **One Hundred Forty Nine Thousand Two Hundred (\$149,200.00)**, consisting of a bid of One Hundred Forty Two Thousand Three Hundred Dollars (\$142,300.00) for all of the Transite

Panel and Caulking Work, and a bid of Six Thousand Nine Hundred Dollars (\$6,900.00) for the Hillside Ceiling Tile/Glue/Sheetrock Work; and

Be It Further Resolved, that the Business Administrator is authorized to return the bid bonds to all but the three (3) lowest bidders; and

Be It Further Resolved, that the Board hereby directs its Special Counsel for Construction to prepare the contracts for the Project, transmit same to Metro for execution, and to obtain all the documents required thereby; and

Be It Further Resolved, that upon receipt of the executed contract from Metro, as well as the insurance certificate, bonds and other documents required by the contract, the Business Administrator is authorized to return the bid bonds to all remaining bidders.

3.16 Award of Contract – Road Construction and Paving – Heritage Middle School

Whereas, on June 1, 2011, the Livingston Board of Education ("Board") held a public bid opening for the Parking Lot Renovations at the Heritage Middle School project ("Project"); and

Whereas, the Board received two (2) bids at the public bid opening; and

Whereas, the lowest bid was submitted by Crossroads Pavement Maintenance, LLC ("Crossroads"), Nutley, New Jersey, with a base bid, inclusive of two (2) Project Allowances of Twelve Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$12,500.00) and Thirty Five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000.00), of Two Hundred Nine Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars (\$209,700.00), a bid of Twenty One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$21,500.00) on Alternate #1 (mill 2" of asphalt and install 2" of FABC Course in the area designated on the Plan as Alt. #1), and a bid of Twenty One Thousand Nine Hundred Seventy Dollars (\$21,970.00) on Alternate #4 (remove existing curbing, topsoil, subsoil, etc., install new curbing, stone, asphalt, etc. to construct new 8-stall parking lot as shown in the Specifications); and

Whereas, the Board, in conjunction with its Design Professional, has determined Crossroads to be the lowest responsive and responsible bidder; and

Whereas, the Board's Special Counsel for Construction has determined Crossroads bid to be awardable.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, that in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-1, et. seq., the Board hereby awards a contract for the Parking Lot Renovations at the Heritage Middle School project to Crossroads Pavement Maintenance, LLC, in the amount of Two Hundred Fifty Three Thousand One Hundred Seventy Dollars (\$253,170.00), consisting of a base bid, inclusive of two (2) Project Allowances of Twelve Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$12,500.00) and Thirty Five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000.00), of Two Hundred Nine Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars (\$209,700.00), a bid of Twenty One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$21,500.00) on Alternate #1, and a bid of Twenty One Thousand Nine Hundred Seventy Dollars (\$21,970.00) on Alternate #4; and

Be It Further Resolved, that the Board hereby directs its Special Counsel for Construction to prepare the contract for the Project, transmit same to Crossroads for execution, and to obtain all the documents required thereby; and

Be It Further Resolved, that upon receipt of the executed contract from Crossroads, as well as the insurance certificate, bonds and other documents required by the contract, the Business Administrator is authorized to return the bid bonds to the bidders.

3.17 <u>Award of Contract – Commissioning Services</u>

Whereas, the Livingston Board of Education ("Board") is currently engaged in a construction project involving facility upgrades to a number of the Board's schools ("Project"); and

Whereas, the Project entails upgrades to a number of the systems at the various schools, including, but not limited to HVAC, lighting, and elevators; and

Whereas, the Board has determined that it is in its best interests to retain a professional engineering firm to provide professional commissioning services ("Services") in order to ensure that all of the systems affected by the Project have been completed and are fully operational within the requirements of the Project Specifications; and

Whereas, the Board solicited proposals from multiple professional engineering firms to provide the Services; and

Whereas, the Board received two (2) proposals in response to its solicitation; and

Whereas, the Board has determined that the proposal submitted by Camp Dresser & McKee, Inc, Philadelphia, PA, is responsive to the Board's solicitation, is the most advantageous to the Board, and that Camp Dresser & McKee, Inc. has the appropriate expertise to provide the Services; and

Whereas, N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-5 permits a board of education to negotiate and award a contract for professional services without public advertising and bidding therefore; and

Whereas, the Services constitute professional services as defined by the Statute.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, that in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-1, et. seq., the Board hereby awards a contract for the Services to Camp Dresser & McKee, Inc. in an amount not to exceed Three Hundred Forty Four Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars (\$344,700.00); and

Be It Further Resolved, that the Board hereby authorizes the Business Administrator, with the assistance of the Board's Special Counsel for Construction to negotiate and prepare the contract for the Services with Camp Dresser & McKee, Inc.; and
