Whereas, the Board now seeks to take the initial steps in order to proceed with the Project:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF LIVINGSTON IN THE COUNTY OF ESSEX, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, as follows:

Section 1. In accordance with the requirements of Section 6A:26-3 of the New Jersey Administrative Code, the Board hereby approves the Educational Specifications prepared in connection with the project and the Board further authorizes the submission of same to the Essex County Superintendent of Schools and the New Jersey Department of Education for approval.

3.7 Award of Contract - Copiers

Whereas, the Livingston Board of Education obtained pricing for the replacement of copiers throughout the District. These copiers can be networked for use as printers, scanners and fax machines; and

Whereas, Konica Minolta Business Solutions, USA, Inc. provided us with a proposal under state contract A52046 and WSCA number 1715 in the amount of \$29,157.84 per month (which includes 1,550,000 copies per month, service, toner and staples) for 48 months for 109 machines and a cost for additional copies of .0049 for black and white and .049 for color; and

Whereas, this agreement saves the District approximately \$5,000.00 per month or \$60,000.00 per year from what is currently being spent;

Now Therefore Be It Resolved, that the Livingston Board of Education enter into a contract with Konica Minolta Business Solutions, USA, Inc. for a 48 month period.

 - 6. Tactics and techniques utilized in protecting public property where disclosure could impair protection.
 - 7. Investigation of violations or possible violations of law.
 - 8. Pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation other than collective bargaining agreement.
 - 9. Personnel matters unless the individual employees or appointees affected requested that such matter be discussed at a public meeting.
 - 10. Deliberations occurring after a public hearing that may result in the imposition of a specific civil penalty.
- (B) The matters discussed will be made public when confidentiality is no longer required and formal action pursuant to said discussion shall take place only at a meeting to which the public has been invited.
