In addition we are very fortunate to be served by a team of five administrators. The newest addition to the leadership team in Student Services is Mrs. Krystie Loeuis. Technology for All!

This year LPS students have access to even more technology that has opened new and exciting avenues of learning. One of these exciting avenues originated within the Department of Student Services and is now accessible by all LPS students. TextHelp Read and Write for Google is one of a growing number of extensions available for download. Based on accolades from last year's pilot, coupled with evidence of successful student utilization of the software, we have decided to invest in a District subscription for 2016-2017. Read and Write is a program that allows learners to access a number of helpful tools that support the reading and writing process. Tools for reading include text to speech and study tools that result in higher levels of interaction and understanding of instructional texts. Writing tools include speech to text and research tools that promote increased writing proficiency. Additionally, this software allows teachers and students to communicate via voice notes to comment on or ask questions about their reading and writing. Learning Ally is an additional technology based resource that is being accessed by K-12 special education teachers. The resource contains over 83,000 titles of audiobooks for students to have access to a human voice reader, as well as accompanied text with highlighting to assist with their reading process. In addition, since each student has a unique login, they are able to access the audiobooks from home. This is another avenue for incorporating technology as a tool for assisting with learning. Teachers will be assigning students to specific books as it relates to their guided reading, current novels and content specific materials. Students also have the opportunity to add books for leisure and recreational reading purposes.
