### Hannah August, Class of 2001



Hannah has served as Press Secretary to First Lady Michelle Obama since May 2011. Previously, she served as Press Secretary to Attorney General Eric Holder, acting as spokeswoman for press communications in high profile cases. In 2008, she was the Deputy Communications Director for a Senatorial Campaign Committee and served as Deputy

Press Secretary for Senator Bob Menendez. She graduated from the University of Pennsylvania in 2005 with a major of International Relations.

#### Nikki M James, Class of 1999



Nikki is an award-winning actress on OFF-BROADWAY, BROADWAY and television. She performed in *The Adventures of Tom Sawyer* while attending NYU, played in *House of Flowers* and was in the original casts for *All Shook Up* and *Bernarda Alba*. She played Dorothy in the production of *The Wiz* for which she won the 2006 *Craig Noel Award for Theatrical Excellence*.

She appeared in Walmartopia. In 2008, she played Juliet in Romeo and Juliet and starred opposite Christopher Plummer as Cleopatra in Caesar and Cleopatra at the Stratford Shakespeare Festival. She continues to perform in and won the 2011 TONY Award for Featured Actress in a Musical for Book of Mormon. Her television credits included Guest Leads on Law and Order: Criminal Intent, The Jury, Third Watch and 30Rock. She worked with Spike Lee on a PSA for the United Negro College Fund. Soon to be released are the film version of the musical "Lucky Stiff" in which she will star alongside Jason Alexander and "The Disappearance of Eleanor Rigby" starring James McAvoy and Jessica Chastain.

#### Governor Chris Christie, Class of 1980



Governor Christie attended the University of Delaware and Seton Hall University School of Law and then joined a Cranford law firm where he was soon named a partner. He was elected a Freeholder in Morris County, and served as Director of the Board in 1997. He was named U.S. Attorney of New Jersey in 2002. As the chief federal law enforcement officer in New Jersey, he earned praise and

drew national attention for his efforts in battling political corruption, corporate crime, human trafficking, gangs, terrorism and polluters. He led a widely acclaimed charge against public corruption. One of his finest moments was when he led the team that thwarted terrorists' plans to attack our military men and women at Fort Dix. He left the U.S. Attorney's office on December 1, 2008 and was sworn in as New Jersey's 55<sup>th</sup> Governor on January 19, 2010.

#### Ronnie Konner, Class of 1966



Senora Konner is a Spanish teacher at Riker Hill and Burnet Hill Elementary Schools in Grades K-5. Her school and community service experience is broad. Her LPS school related work includes, Livingston P-T Council, as a founder of LEF, the LPS Strategic Planning Committee and Technology Committee, the Multicultural Committees at Riker Hill.

Burnet Hill and Hillside and several positions on H.S.A.'s. She was a member of and served as President and Vice President of the Livingston Board of Education. She served on the Montclair State University Network for Educational Renewal — Geraldine R. Dodge Grant. She has collaborated with the Intercambio Escolar — Sister School Exchange Riker Hill and Burnet Hill Schools with Escuela Primaria Gregorio Cruz y Rodriguez, San Jose del Cabo, Mexico since 2001 and continues to serve on the NCJW since 1975.


# **John Hopton**



Mr. Hopton came to the Livingston Public Schools (LPS) in 1983 and served for the next seven years as K-12 Director of Computer Education and K-12 Supervisor of Instructional Computing. He then served as Principal of Burnet Hill Elementary School and of Mt. Pleasant Elementary School. His choice to pursue an educational career was based on the simple realization that very little in life is more important than learning to learn. It is his belief that the level of change in our society mandates

an evolving learner capable of coping with change, and taking informed action. Over the years his passion was fueled by studying how people learn best, and developing strategies for helping them on that journey. His was the voice that offered the word 'empowerment' to the LPS mission statement, "Empowering all to learn, create, contribute and grow".

#### Dr. Barbara Tamburro



In 1979, there were four string players enrolled in the LHS orchestra and forty additional string players disbursed throughout the school district. Within ten years, the number rose to 450. Dr. Tamburro served as a Strings Teacher and Orchestral Conductor grades 4-12 from 1979-2010. During her tenure she was an Elementary Choral Conductor and taught General Music. She went on to establish the Townwide Elementary Orchestra. She authored *The Corda Collection* as

chaired the North Jersey Region Orchestra Auditions, was a clinician for the American String Teachers Association and the Music Educators National Conference, was a two time recipient of the Women's Achievement in Education Award from Douglass College, founded the NJ/ASTA Annual Symposium (American String Teachers Association) and chaired the ASTA State Solo Festival. She served as conductor for NJ All State Intermediate Orchestra 2008.

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
