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The need for such a survey is clear. The "drug problem" and the context within which substance use and abuse occurs will not improve without intervention.

Like other local and national studies of drug use, this survey attempts to shed light on and more accurately describe the ever-changing use of illicit drugs by youth. With prevalence and trend data, public debate can be enhanced and resources and policymaking can be based on evidence, not misconceptions. Information received through this survey has been very valuable in helping community organizations, coalitions, and schools develop needed research- and evidence-based prevention and intervention services throughout Essex County, NJ.

The 2018 Youth Survey involved 2,983 students from grades 6-12. The survey was administered during the month of January in 2018. The study describes recent trends in the use, perceived harm, parental and peer disapproval, availability, and access associated with a variety of drugs. Other contextual features (perceived safety, physical and emotional status, etc.) are also presented. This report is divided into 6 sections. First, we outline the **Study Design and Methods** used in the implementation of the study, including a description of the population of students involved in the study. This is followed by an **Executive Summary** of the 2018 survey. This section contains a brief discussion of the study. Based on the fact that no two substances are used, acquired, or perceived in the same ways—and that significant differences exist in the data between the drug classes—we provide **Specific Results for 30 Day Use**, **Perception of Risk of Harm, Perception of Parental Disapproval** and **Perception of Peer Disapproval**, which are the Core Measures tracked by the federal government for Alcohol, Tobacco and Marijuana, and **Past Year Use** for all of the other drugs by combined grade level. Further information is provided on the **Risk and Protective Factors** identified in the survey, school factors, activity levels and types, perceptions of safety, and **Where Youth Obtain Drugs and Alcohol**.



Study Design and Methods



The Alcohol & Drug Abuse Prevention Team contracted with Epiphany Community Services to deliver the biannual drug and alcohol survey, based on the Communities That Care Survey for a random sample of students in grades 6-12. The final analysis was completed by Epiphany Community Service, LLC. The survey was given in January of 2018. A total of surveys were completed with rejection rate/ incompletion rate of 25.3% (756 surveys) for a total 2,227 surveys being used, providing a greater than 95% confidence level of the results.

Surveys were rejected when:

1. The student answered questions inconsistently, saying they did not use in the past year but did use in the last 30 days;

- 2. The student answered they took the "fake" drug;
- 3. The student answered they took all of the drugs all of the time at the highest level possible
- 4. Surveys taken outside the time of administration
- 5. Surveys were considered incomplete if any questions were unanswered.

Because of the size of the 2018 survey (N=2,227, representing a total population of 3,367 in grades 6-12, the margin of error for all respondents is estimated to be approximately 1.2% with a 95% confidence interval. Such a confidence interval means that for any particular statistic reported there is a 95% probability that the true value falls in a range from -1.2 to + 1.2 around the value. For example, if 75% of respondents endorse a particular item, then the reader can interpret this to mean there is a 95% chance the true score falls in the range of 73.8% to 76.2%. The confidence interval decreases along and the margin of error increases as the grades are broken down. The grade and gender breakdown is depicted in the following table.

• Limitations

• It is important to note that survey results are based on the responses of students who were in attendance the day the survey was administered as well as the proportion of respondents to each individual question. Since some students were not present and some did not answer every question on the survey, not every question was based on the same number of respondents.

• It is also important to note that self-reported is sometimes criticized for being inaccurate; especially when the target population is youth or the topic under question is illicit drug use behavior. Self-reports can be influenced by a variety of factors, including lapses in memory, the desire to appear a certain way (either "better" or "worse than one's actual behavior might indicate), and the ability to comprehend the question. Specific research procedures can be put in place to increase the chances of students reporting truthfully. It has been found that school-based; self-administered surveys like the 2018 Youth Survey "appear to yield higher prevalence than either telephone surveys or face-to-face interviews, but lower prevalence than biochemical indicators of substance use or methods that provide even greater anonymity. The most objective comparison data, and low self-reported use of a fictitious drug suggest that most self-reported behaviors on school-based surveys are likely valid but some underreporting may occur." While self-reports have their weaknesses, they are perhaps one of the best ways to determine many of the things we are seeking in this survey, like age of onset, perceptions of harm, and perceptions of availability. "Survey research can provide a much greater range of information for use in designing intervention strategies."¹

• Format of the Report

• The report is laid out in a graphical format depicting use for all grades, broken down by grade and gender for core measures of substance using behavior. The report is broken down into the key categories of the four core measures, past year use, access, risk factors protective factors, and family.

Executive Summary




- Alcohol is the number one drug of choice, followed by e-cigarettes and marijuana.
- Females have a slightly higher rate of use than males.
- Older students are more likely to use than younger students.
- Very few students are using harder drugs, such as methamphetamine, ecstasy, LSD, heroin, or cocaine.
- Students perceive the most risk from drinking 5 or more drinks once or twice a week and the least amount of risk from trying marijuana once or twice.
- Females perceive higher risk than males.
- Older students perceive less risk than younger students.
- Students perceived the most parental disapproval for tobacco and the least parental disapproval for alcohol.
- Females perceived more parental disapproval than males
- Younger students perceived more parental disapproval than older students.
- Students perceived the least peer disapproval for marijuana use and the most disapproval for Rx drugs.
- Males and older students perceived the least amount of peer disapproval
- Most students at least somewhat disapprove of their peers drinking alcohol every day.
- Almost half of all respondents reported enjoying being in school.
- Most respondents reported trying their best in school.
- Over half of all respondents said the school does not let their parents know when they've done something well.
- Only 41.9% said the school lets their parents know when they did something well.
- Most respondents did not have any friends who sold illegal drugs or dropped out of school.
- A little over 30% of respondents had at least one friend who tried alcohol in the past year.
- Most respondents do not believe using substances would make them seem cool.





- 12th graders were more likely than other students to perceive being seen as cool for smoking cigarettes, smoking hookah, smoking marijuana, and using prescription drugs not prescribed to them.
- 9th graders were more likely than other students to perceive being seen as cool for using e-cigarettes, drinking alcohol, and carrying a handgun.
- • Over 98% of respondents have not sold illegal drugs or been drunk or high at school.
- Students perceived alcohol to be the easiest to obtain substance, following by e-cigarettes, and Rx drugs.
- Older students perceived most substances as being easier to obtain than younger students.
- When asked where they would get alcohol, the most common response was from home without permission, followed by their parents, and their friend's home without permission.
- • When asked where they would access prescription drugs, 80.7% said from home with permission.
- Students believe it is more likely to get caught smoking marijuana than drinking or taking Rx drugs.
- Almost half of all respondents report knowing at least one adult who has gotten drunk or high in the past year.
- Most students have not had a family member with a severe alcohol or drug problem.
- Almost 90% of all respondents said the rules in their family are clear and that their family has rules about alcohol and drug use.

 - Younger students were more likely to report they would get caught by their parents if they drank alcohol. Older students were less likely to report that their parents asked if they got their homework done.







Several conclusions can be drawn from the data. These include:

- Most kids in Livingston do not use alcohol, tobacco, or harder drugs.
- Rates of alcohol and marijuana use for 11th and 12th grade students are much higher.
- Older students report alcohol, e-cigarettes, and marijuana as sort of easy or very easy to get.
- Students do not feel they are getting support from the school or their peers, although they do feel they are supported by their parents.
- Students perceive less parental disapproval as they get older.



Recommendations



Several recommendations can be made as a result of the data in order to affect the results and better utilize the information provided. These include:

1. Review the data with others in the community and school to provide appropriate context for the information provided.

2.Engage the females and 10th graders in the district to gain a better understanding of their motivation to engage in risky behavior.

3. Reinforce the availability and opportunities to get involved in the school.

4. Reinforce the positive choice the students are making to ensure all youth understand that use is not the norm.

5. Share the summary with students, ask them what they think their peers need to know, what their parents need to know, and what the school needs to know. Use this information as the foundation for creating talking points for each of these audiences from a youth perspective.


6. Review the data with the coalition to determine what additional conclusions can be drawn from this new information.

7. As part of the review, identify areas for more information. Use this to frame questions to be answered during qualitative data gathering, such as coalition discussions, or listening sessions with youth or parents.









Past Year Use Data Findings

The following tables and charts provide information on the number of youth who have used at least one time for each substance, or has engaged in a substance use actively, in the past year. This type of information enables the reader to gauge the types and extent of various drug use.

Risk and Protective Factor Data Findings

The discipline of epidemiology (the study of factors impacting health in populations) has developed four constructs to help measure and describe drug use: host, agent, vector, and environment. The host is the person or population using drugs. The agent is the drug. The vector is the mechanism by which agents are distributed. And, the environment includes "familial, social, cultural, historical, economic, political, legal, and media factors"² in which the agent, host, and vectors function. "Without accurate knowledge of the epidemiology, the development and implementation of prevention, treatment, and policy mechanisms to deal with drug abuse cannot succeed."² In this section, we will examine a number of environmental factors, including school factors, activity levels and types, perceptions of safety, mental health factors, and sources of support.

Access to Substances

A risk factor in all communities is the access to substances that can be used to get drunk or high. If access can be eliminated so can use. The analogy is that weapons are readily available on military bases but they are not readily accessible, this means there is little danger of gun violence despite a high number of weapons. The following graphs depict the accessibility of substances in the community with special attention given to alcohol and prescription drugs.







Consequences and Communication








Role Modeling






Think of your four best friends. In the past year, how many of your best friends:

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
