



2019-2020 Instrumental Music Registration Information

All students are encouraged to elect to learn to play an instrument in the Band or Orchestra for their fourth and fifth grade year. Today, a special assembly was held at your child's school for all third grade students. All band and orchestra instruments that are available to beginners were demonstrated by the music faculty at the assembly. The purpose of the program was to acquaint students with these instruments in terms of sound, shape, and size. With your guidance, your child should have the information to make a choice as to what instrument they would like to play next year.

The instruments available in our beginning classes are as follows:

BAND: Flute, Oboe, Clarinet, Alto Saxophone, Trumpet, Trombone, Baritone Horn, Percussion

ORCHESTRA: Violin, Viola, Cello

Please note that most instruments must be provided by the parent/guardian. A limited number of the larger instruments (Viola, Cello, Trombone, Baritone Horn) are owned by the district and are available for students to borrow at no charge on a first come-first served basis.

Most families choose to rent instruments at least for the first year. The choice of the music vendor lies strictly with you; however, the music department will provide you with a list of music stores in the area. *Please be aware that there are significant differences in rental prices.* These differences directly correlate with the size of the instrument. For example, an alto saxophone costs more to rent than a flute and generally, the larger the instrument, the greater the cost.

Please do not rent an instrument until you are contacted by your school's music teacher. You will be contacted by email before the end of the school year with your child's instrument assignment and will also be provided with a list of music vendors in the area. We recommend against purchasing an instrument at this point. Purchasing an instrument online is strongly discouraged. If you have a special situation/financial need, or question, please contact your child's Instrumental Music Teacher as soon as possible.

You will be amazed at the results by January! As part of the six-day rotation, students will be scheduled for a half-hour group lesson once each rotation and be excused from their regular class. Parents of students enrolled in the Instrumental Music Program will be provided with a detailed schedule of the lesson rotation prior to the beginning of lessons in September.
