

# **Scheduling FAQs:**

#### How will I know when my scheduling meeting is?

You will receive a Remind notice from your counselor prior to your meeting, so be sure that you have joined your counselor's class! If your counselor is not able to contact you via Remind, you will receive a paper pass.

#### What will we discuss at my scheduling meeting?

You and your counselor will review your progress this year, teacher recommendations, graduation requirements and your future plans to determine the best courses. Please review the course guide ahead of time and be prepared to speak about electives you would like to take, including backups.

#### Who can I speak to if I'm not sure what course/level would be best for me?

Your teachers, the department supervisors and your counselor are all people you can go to with questions about courses and levels.

#### What happens if I did my course selection and I want to make a change?

You have can make a change to your schedule between June 24th until August 15th. After this date a change of course window will be available in the Fall. A schedule change form is required for any change request in the Fall.

 A schedule change form required for any changes made during the Fall scheduling windows. There are three windows to request level changes once the 2019-2020 school year starts. Dates for these windows will be communicated to parents via email and the LHS Student handbook:

Dates	Changes Permitted	Transcript Notation	Grade Calculation for 1st Marking Period
TBD Summer 2019	Move Up or Drop in level	None	Grade = 100% from new course.  Moving up a level: Student will make up all missing work including summer assignments by October 1, 2018.  Dropping down a level: Student will make up all missing work with the exception of summer assignments.
TBD Summer 2019	Drop in level only	None	Grade = 50% from original course and 50% from new course.
TBD Summer 2019	Drop in level only	"WP" or "WF"	Grade = 100% from original course.

- All signatures are required to process a level change.



#### Where can I learn about courses for acceleration?

You can read about taking courses for acceleration (through the ISLO process) on page 38 of the <u>course guide</u>. You can also review the ISLO application on the LHS School Counseling website.

Will I be able to see a list of the courses I requested during my scheduling meeting?

Yes, you will be able to view your course requests in Genesis through April 5th.

# Are some students given preference in regards to requested courses? What are the chances that I will get the electives I requested?

No one student has an advantage over another. Being first or last to have a scheduling meeting

has no impact on your chances of getting your requested courses. When entering requests we will be mindful of graduation requirements, academic performance, school and life balance and AP application completion. Your counselor will ask you to provide back-up options for your elective choices. While we cannot guarantee that you will get all of your requested electives, it is likely that you will get some combination of your first and backup choices.



#### What can I do if I missed the AP application deadline?

If you have missed the February 1st AP application deadline, speak with the supervisor who oversees the department of the course to ask about waitlist opportunities.

- Review and discuss teacher recommendations with parent(s), teachers and your school counselor
