
ESPAÑOL 4H - TRABAJO DE VERANO 2022

Dear students,

Congratulations on your decision to take Spanish 4 Honors. As it is expected with honor classes, this year you will be required to complete additional reading, research, essays and projects. We will cover the curriculum at a faster pace and in a greater depth while incorporating



more complex grammar structures. The "CAN DOs Statements" below are focused on the Intermediate-Mid

level of proficiency as you complete the work.

Rationale

Students enrolled in Spanish 4H are required to complete the summer assignment prior to the start of class in September. Transitioning from a level 3 course to a level 4 course is substantial. Therefore, summer assignments have been selected to continue the development of more advanced communication skills in listening, speaking, reading, and writing.

General directions

Read the assignment descriptions carefully. Each section has some required activities. You may use an online dictionary (e.g. <u>www.wordreference.com</u>). You are required to abide by the honor code that forbids cheating, lying, and stealing within the academic world. In other words I expect that you complete all assignments on your own, without the help of a person or translator. Your work should represent what you are capable of doing using all resources you have, including grammar and notes from previous studies. This work is intended to assess your skills upon starting the new school year.

Task # 1: Reading

INTERPRETIVE READING "Can-Do" Statements

• I can easily understand the main idea and some pieces of information on familiar topics from sentences and series of connected sentences within texts that are written, or signed.

Our first unit in Spanish 4 Honors will explore the Revolution in Latin America in the 1900s. Therefore, your reading assignment will introduce you to its foundation on which we will expand in September.
