




HMS STUDENTS SCREAM FOR ICE CREAM!

NISLA- MATH NEWS

The NJSLA Math Assessments are a few weeks away! Over the course of this year, teachers have been preparing students for this assessment. Our math curriculum is based on the same content standards (Common Core and New Jersey Student Learning Standards) after which the assessment is modeled. As part of the math department's efforts to prepare students for the NJSLA Math tests, practice questions have been infused in class notes, homework assignments, and assessments. In the weeks prior to the test, teachers will also navigate students through a tutorial and online sample questions to ensure students are comfortable working with the assessment's web-based platform. The NJSLA mathematics questions involve many interesting mathematical concepts and their applications as they relate to each specific grade level. We invite you to have discussions at home in which you work with your child on practice questions.
