

## **MIDSUMMER NIGHT'S DREAM**

The students of Mrs. Biss and Ms. Morano's classes have been working on a cross-curricular documentary project. The students are explaining a Renaissance value present in the play "A Midsummer Night's Dream" and during the time period of the Renaissance. They are then showing how that value demonstrates continuity and change throughout other time periods and novels studied in class. The students are using WeVideo, an online video-making platform, to put together their documentary films. To culminate the project, the students will take part in an "Oscar" themed awards ceremony to celebrate some of the best

films for categories such as best soundtrack, best narration, best connection of the past to the present, best editing and transitions, most powerful visuals and best picture. The students will also have the opportunity to vote on the

best introduction and hook as well as a best picture.
