Update on FY 24-25 State Aid

- ► On 2/29/24, the DOE announced that State Aid will increase by \$1.04 M or 11.83%
- Across NJ, an increase for 422 districts, decrease for 122 and flat for 15

Type of State Aid	2023-2024	2024-2025	\$ Increase	% Change
Categorical Transportation Aid	\$ 1,303,530	\$ 1,403,282	\$ 99,752	7.65%
Categorical Special Education Aid	\$ 7,049,480	\$ 7,775,498	\$ 726,018	10.30%
Categorical Security Aid	\$ 434,880	\$ 648,405	\$ 213,525	49.10%

Total State Aid

(excl. Extraordinary Aid, Debt Service Aid)* \$ 8,787,890 \$ 9,827,185 \$ 1,039,295 11.83%



^{*}Extraordinary Aid is budgeted to decrease by about \$205,000

^{*}Debt Service Aid decreased by about \$29,000

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Update on FY 24-25 State Aid

- State aid had been budgeted flat (0% increase)
- We had been working on a \$1.3 million shortfall for 2024-25
- ► The \$1 million increase in state aid reduces the shortfall to about \$270,000 at this time.
- ► If we are to add new positions and programs into the 2024-25 budget, we must first reduce expenses by \$270,000 + the costs of the requested additions

- School Counseling

School Counseling 23 School Counselors

- Counselors in each elementary school
- 2 per grade level in middle school that loop with the grade levels
- 10 counselors at LHS
- ▶ 1 College Counselor at LHS



School Nursing 11 School Nurses

- ▶ 1 per building in grades K-8
- ▶ 2 in LHS
- ▶ 1 District Nurse to travel where the need is, often adding support to HMS and LHS



Intervention

Providing targeted Tier 2 instruction to students in grades K-8



Student Assistance Counseling 3 SACs in grades 7-12

2023-24 we added a contracted school social worker to provide Tier 2 interventions via ESSER funds

*In 2024-25 budget, we would like to continue that service



Equity

- 9 Building Equity Coaches
- ➤ 3 Student Equity Advisors

*In the 2024-25 budget, we hope to allocate funds to be utilized towards achieving the goals identified for the future direction of equity.



Special Education

Providing a full continuum of services from pre-K through age 21

- ► 24 CST members, plus 5 LINKS
- ▶ 22 Related Service Providers
- ► 88 Special Educators



*Special Education staff to support IEP programming impacts budget as it is needed.



Capital Projects

ROD Grant Funding

- ► The NJ School Development Authority periodically provides ROD Grants for 40% of the costs of upgrades to existing facilities.
- The Livingston School District recently received approval for more than \$1.6 million in grants for the replacement of boilers and roofs at various schools.

- New boiler construction (40% funded by a ROD grant from NJ DOE)

- New walk-in box for kitchen
- New carpet in main office
- Mill, pave, stripe parking lots
- New shingle roof (40% funded by a ROD Grant from NJ DOE)



Capital Projects Mount Pleasant Middle - Elementary

- Locker replacement/repair/paint
- Paint gym
- Mill, pave, stripe parking lots
- New boiler construction (40% funded by a ROD grant from NJ DOE)



Capital Projects Burnet Hill Elementary School

- Mill, pave, stripe parking lots
- New toilet partitions for boys
- 2 card readers for Annex
- New shingle roof (40% funded by a ROD Grant from NJ DOE)



Capital Projects Collins Elementary School

- Mill, pave, stripe parking lots
- ► PA System upgrade



Capital Projects Harrison Elementary School

- Mill, pave, stripe parking lots
- Mill, pave front walks
- PA System upgrade
- New boiler construction (40% funded by a ROD grant from the NJ DOE)



Capital Projects Hillside Elementary School

- Add parking spaces (approx 11 spaces)
- Mill, pave front walks
- Refinish Café floor (wear and tear)
- 2 card readers for Annex
- PA System upgrade
- New boiler construction (40% funded by a ROD grant from NJ DOE)
