NJ's Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act

- The New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE) has posted school and district Harassment, Intimidation, and Bullying (HIB) grades as stated in the Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act. These grades were determined by a district self-assessment completed jointly with the principals and school safety team.
- Livingston Public Schools has conscientiously implemented the requirements found in the *Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act.* During the years of implementation of the *Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act,* the District has made progress in addressing and improving harassment, intimidation and bullying education, training, and programs, and school climate and culture.

Scoring

- Under the Commissioner's Program, the school grade is a raw score of data and the sum of the ratings on the School Self-Assessment
- The maximum total score for a school is 78 points.
- A school district's grade is an average of the total scores of all schools in the school district.
 - The department-issued grade is not represented as a letter grade.

The district is in compliance in all areas.

- Livingston Public School's HIB Self-Assessment grade is 75.56/78 points for the 2016-2017 school year.
