## New Jersey Graduation Proficiency Assessment (NJGPA)

- 2015 New Jersey adopted the Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC) to replace HSPA and previous assessments in the elementary and middle school in language arts and mathematics.
- 2019 Tests reconfigured and renamed NJSLA (New Jersey Student Learning Assessment)
- 2022 NJGPA first administered in March to Gr. 11 students. NJ State Board of Education designates this
  a Field Test for the Class of 2023.
  - Scale from 650-850 with "cut" score of 750
  - Assesses proficiency in:
    - Grade 10 Language Arts standards
    - Algebra I and Geometry standards
- 2023 March administration to Gr. 11. Now used as a First Pathway in New Jersey High School Graduation Assessment Requirement for Class of 2024.
  - Scale from 650-850 with "cut" score of 725 to indicate "Graduation Ready"
