Did you know Homework should serve one or more of three purposes?

- 1. Practice of a skill or skills;
- 2. Extension of learning;
- 3. Preparation for learning.

We believe that homework should:

- Provide meaningful practice in a subject area without creating unmanageable stress for you or your child;
- Allow your child to consider learning from the school day in ways that will help to deepen their understanding;
- Provide an opportunity to expand their knowledge, skills, and/or interest in a topic prior to arriving to class in a way that allows them to participate more fully in the learning.

How can we help you to make Homework more manageable?

Hopefully, we will first be able to help by telling you that you are not alone. Kids are tired after school, they are involved in so many after school activities that it is difficult to even begin to figure out how you can manage to find time to eat a family dinner and spend quality time catching up with your children. While we do not think children should be overbooked, we value the time spent in activities that are enjoyable and allow students to expand their interests and skills in fun ways. We should all be modeling living a balanced life for our children.

Next, you should know that we are listening.
