

Kindness Matters~

We are often asked to describe our anti-bullying efforts in school. The answer is simple... we teach kindness. The skills required to be kind are, in fact, the most essential tools we can give our students when teaching them to be upstanding, non-bullying human beings. In his book, "Bullying Hurts", Lester Laminack defines five levels for teaching students the skills necessary for kindness:



- ⇒Level 1 We Have So Much in Common
- ⇒Level 2 There Are Ways In Which We are Different- Not Less Than Others, Not Better Than Others, Just Different
- ⇒Level 3 Thinking, Feeling, Acting
- ⇒Level 4 When Others are Not Thoughtful, Caring, and Kind
- ⇒Level 5 An Opportunity to Explore the Actions of Others, Reflect On Our Own Feelings, and Redirect Our Behaviors Toward Fellow Human Beings

Our six elementary schools and Mt. Pleasant Middle School use this curriculum as their starting point for teaching kindness through children's literature. The levels are taught in large community events where students gather to consider selected text. As classes, they discuss, debate, and have decision making opportunities throughout the month. There are supplemental texts to assist the conversation. Each school is required by the Anti-Bullying Laws in NJ to have an Anti-Bullying Specialist (ABS). These are the individuals who coordinate the work towards building kindness skills at the appropriate developmental ages. You can find your school's ABS on the district and school website. Our schools spend a great deal of time in groups and with individual students building kindness skills through conversation, school counseling lessons, and of course, special events.
