## Being an Involved Parent in the Department of Inspiration

As leaders in LPS we have the unique gift of collaborating with talented and involved parents. Recently, I have heard questions about how parents can get involved in the areas of equity, inclusion, intervention, and inspiration. This volume of our newsletter will focus on just that! The opportunities to be involved in your child's schools have grown exponentially in the last ten years. Please find a few examples below.

Each school in Livingston has a SEPAC - Special Education Parent Advisory Committee in every building. These are parent-led groups who collaborate with school staff and administration to celebrate our children's accomplishments, discuss district programming and initiatives, answer questions, and solve problems. All parents of students who are educated in and out of the district are welcome to be members of this committee. These are active groups who advertise their meetings with personal invitations to all families of children in and out of district. Parents are invited to their child's home school SEPAC meeting but are welcome to attend any of the meetings across the district. You will find a schedule below and on our district SEPAC website. Each of these SEPAC's has two leaders who are selected through the HSA process for committee chairs and are appointed by building principals. The leaders meet as a whole executive team to share ideas and ask questions of each other and district leaders including BOE members. SEPAC leaders also share new information and updates at the building HSA meetings. We are so very proud of the incredible work of our SEPAC's ~ you will see some of their scheduled meetings below, but can also find important information on our SEPAC website.

**Building Equity Teams** began in 2020 in response to equity concerns our students, parents, and staff had as a result of events at the national, state, and local levels. Our staff and administrators sought out support in our work towards creating schools where equity and inclusion were the focus for staff, administrators, students, and

parents. Each building equity team has parent representatives as standing members of their committees. These teams examine school culture and design interventions and programming to support our expectations for equity, inclusion, and anti-racism. This year the building equity teams will be **focusing on developing community engagement surrounding this topic for each school community.** These community opportunities are wonderful ways for parents to get involved in creating schools that allow every child to feel beloved and feel like they belong. We are in the process of creating equity affinity groups for parents and staff to work together to ensure specific groups have a voice in our work. **School Safety Teams** have been a part of every school since the beginning of laws for Harassment, Intimidation, and Bullying in the 2011-2012 school year. School Safety Teams examine the culture of the school in an effort to strengthen the programming and supports to create a more inclusive school that is free from bullying. Much of the exciting work that occurs through this committee will be shared out this month as we celebrate a month of respect. Each school will be engaging in activities with our students to celebrate our differences and teach ways to be positive members of our communities. Additionally, our anti-bullying specialists provide HIB training for parents annually at an HSA meeting. Please see your HSA calendar for that meeting date. **Parent Academies** have been around for a very long time. These are opportunities for parents to work directly with our expert staff to learn about a variety of topics.
