### **LHS School Score Summary for 2019**

- **745** students were enrolled in 1 or more AP courses
- 717 students sat for at least one exam
  - This includes students who were and were not enrolled in the corresponding class
- 1,693 exams were taken
  - 91.5% of the students scored 3 or higher in 2019
  - **69%** of the students scored 4 or higher
- The number of AP test takers increased by 5.1% since 2019
- The number of exams that were taken has increased by 4.1% since 2019






# SAT 2019 Overall Mean Scores Livingston vs. New Jersey vs. National

#### Mean SAT Scores - LPS v. NJ v. Nation




### Percent of Students Meeting College Readiness Benchmarks




### English Language Standards Analysis – Percent of Students at each Performance Level

### NJ Student Learning Assessment for Science

The NJSLA-S measures student proficiency with the NJ Student Learning Standards for Science and is administered to students in grades 5, 8 and 11.

- Examines students' performance of scientific and engineering practices in the context of cross-cutting concepts and disciplinary core ideas
- Three dimensional nature of the standards requires complex performance assessment tasks.
- Spring 2019 was a baseline test. Results are due to be reported to schools.
