Transition from PRIDE to Kindergarten – what does that mean?

Kindergarten - what does that look like?

- Emphasis is on building peer relationships
 - Facilitated through play
 - Working together at table
 - Partner work for learning

• Lots of language, exploring and creativity

• This is not so different from PRIDE!

How is this different from PRIDE?

- Home/School Communication will look slightly different
 - o E-mails, notes home from school, teacher pages
- Emphasis on student-skills
 - Sitting on the rug for whole group instruction
 - Working independently at the tables
- Transportation
- Length of day
- Different Child Study Team members for support (if BHE is not home school)

Supports

• Teacher support

- Classroom aide support
 - Additional support based on student needs (i.e. Therapists)

Pack all together, including water bottle

Easy open containers, packages (put a small slit)

Utensils

Napkins

Clothing:

Practical, easy on/off

Jacket, go out when chilly

Sneakers, outside everyday

Odds and Ends...

Self-help skills:

Unpacking

Cleaning up

Advocating for themselves\

Playground:

Visit new school to become comfortable

May meet new students and families

Odds and Ends...

Routine/Hours:

Longer day for most, get used to earlier bedtime, start new routine a few weeks before September

Homework – work with them, don't do it for them. Teachers need to know what the children know
