

LIVINGSTON BOARD OF EDUCATION VOTING MEETING MINUTES

A **Voting Meeting** of the Livingston Board of Education was held on this date in the Livingston High School Auditorium. The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by the Board President, Charles August, who announced that adequate notice of this meeting has been provided by amendment to notice approved at the Board's reorganization meeting on January 7, 2019 and posted at the Board of Education office and communicated to *The Star Ledger, West Essex Tribune, TAPinto Livingston* and the Livingston Township Clerk.
