 - Academic advising, Career Development Center, Student Life, Campus Engagement, Residential Living, Office of Disability Resources



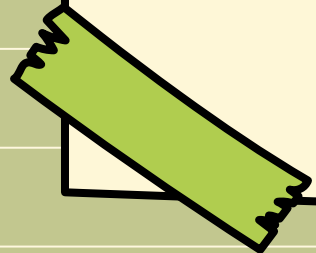

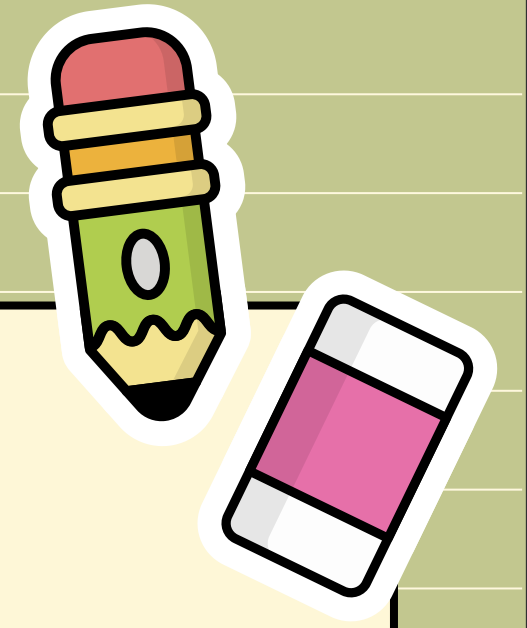

- Maroon level: 3 hours: 1:1 coaching, 2 our career development and social groups.
- Silver: 1 hour: used at the end of their undergraduate studies, bi weekly 1:1 coaching

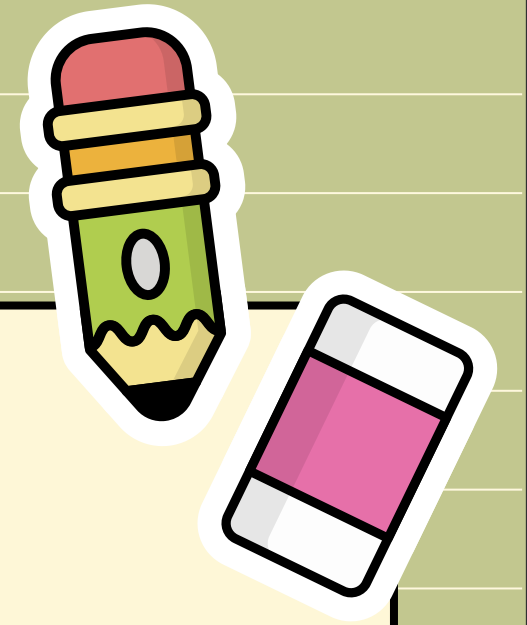
Living accommodations: sensory reduced area, peer mentors and single residence halls upon request.

Residential program fee \$2500 a semester.



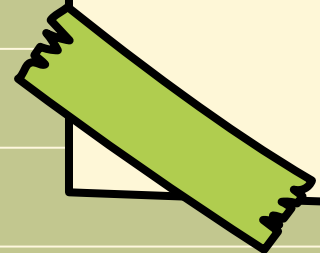

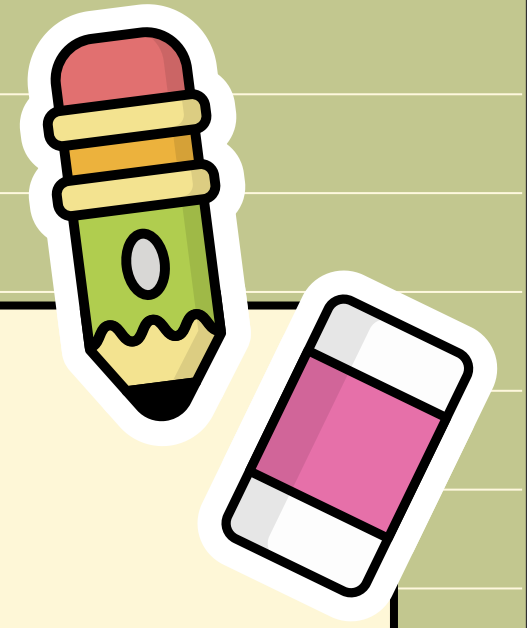

Academics, Communication, Daily living skills, Employment readiness and Social skills

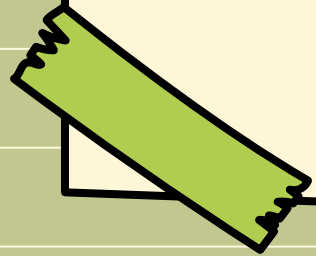

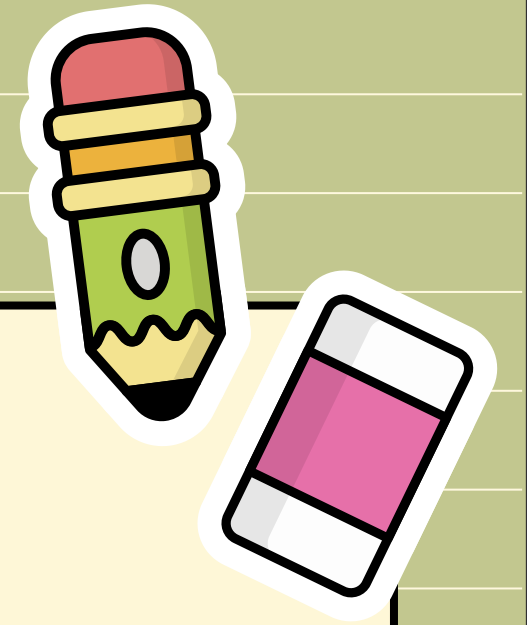
ENHANCE consists of the following components:

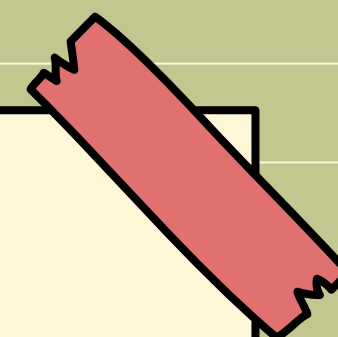
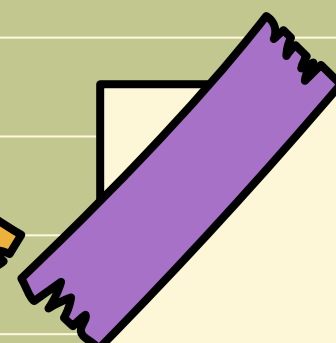
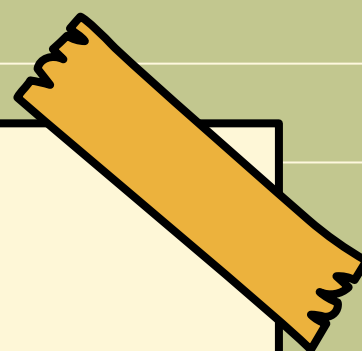
The UM group falls under the office of Academic Support and Access Partnerships
